JOURNAL OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, PERRY COUNTY, MISSOURI.

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Perry County, Missouri, met at City Hall in said City on the above date in regular session pursuant to adjournment. Present: Curt Buerck, Tom Guth, Dennis House, Douglas K. Martin, Clint Rice, and David J. Schumer, Aldermen; Brent Buerck, City Administrator; Tracy Prost, City Clerk; and Art Pistorio, City Attorney. Absent: Larry Riney, Mayor.

Mayor-Pro Tem Guth opens the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and invocation.

Mayor-Pro Tem Guth now asks for citizens' participation from the floor.

Jerry Favier of 329 North School Street expresses his concerns about the possibility of rainwater getting into his basement. He asks if there is a way for the manhole lid to be lifted during heavy rains to help alleviate the pressure of the rainwater. He tells the Board that he has already installed a shutoff valve, a flipper, and a sump pump but is still concerned. City Administrator Buerck and City Engineer Baer tell the Board and Mr. Favier that the new manhole and pipes that are planned for installation should eliminate the problem; however, the projects are still being scheduled for construction. They also discuss the possibility of Mr. Favier's line being moved to the pipe from Grand Avenue. After further discussion, the Board asks City Engineer Baer to assess Mr. Favier's situation and determine the best way to help eliminate the problem.

At this time, Gail Winkler of The Meadows of Perryville asks the Board why she and others in her retirement community are paying a franchise fee to Spectrum. She also tells the Board that they have been told that Spectrum is the only internet that is allowed in their area. City Administrator Buerck explains that the franchise fee comes to the city of Perryville and the percentage is being reduced by one-half percent each year. Alderman Martin states that he will check to determine why other providers are not able to provide service in The Meadows of Perryville area.

There being no one else coming forth, Mayor-Pro Tem Guth closes the citizens' participation portion of the meeting.

- **EDA Strategic Plan** - The next EDA board meeting to finalize strategies from our strategic planning sessions is April 6th.
- **The Future of Cities Webinar** - March 20th at 1 pm we will be streaming this event at the Catalyst Center for anyone interested. The focus of the discussion is on central business districts (downtowns) and how cities can support and grow these districts.

City Administrator Report:

- **The Future of Cities Article** - This event is scheduled for March 20 at 1pm at the Catalyst Center as Crystal will be our hostess. Richard Florida is famous for his work in this space and it promises to be very informational.
- **Spring Cleanup Flyer** - Spring cleanup is fast approaching and appointments for this year can be scheduled between April 10-20.
- **SendAFriend Business Article** - This was a neat article about a young man in Jackson who started his own company, delivering good will and well wishes to people across the country.
- **Airport Fly-In Featuring B-25 – May 20, 2023** - The Airport Advisory Board has worked to secure a B-25 for our upcoming Fly-In. We are having to make minimal assurances and commitments that it is financially solvent for them but it will help take our event to the next level.
- **Show Me Green Sales Tax Weekend – April 19-25** - This annual event forgives sales tax on energy efficient appliances.
- **Security Test Email** - Everyone with an email address recently received a new training on “phishing” scams. We would ask you to spend the four minutes watching the video and then take the 6-question test to document your understanding. Eventually, our plan is for all of our elected officials to have a city of Perryville email address.

City Engineer Report:

- **2022 Street Improvement Project - Moulton St.** – Sidewalks are being poured this week. The last section of pavement will be poured next week.

- **U.V. Treatment System at Airport Wastewater Treatment Plant** – Piping is being installed; concrete should be poured tomorrow; and installation of equipment is expected next week.

- **Generators at Show-Me and Welty** – We expect delivery of these generators soon.

- **PATH Grant** – The Notice to Proceed was received from MoDot and we issued the Notice to Proceed from the City.

Assistant Chief of Police Report:

- **Police Officers** – We continue our efforts to recruit officers – most cities are facing a shortage of officers.

- **Code Enforcement** – Until a new Code Enforcement Officer can be hired, the Police Department will be handling code violations.

- **St. Louis County** – St. Louis County has asked about a burn permit for the 400 block of North Perryville Boulevard.

- **Software** – We are searching for a software to distribute calls to all officers.

Parks & Rec Report:

- **24-Hour Access** – Kiefner Construction has started on the 24-Hour Access project. It should be completed in approximately six weeks.

- **LWCF Grant for Lucas and Friends Playground** – We have made it past the first round and believe we have a good chance of receiving this grant. Awards will not be made until 2024.

Mayor-Pro Tem Guth asks the Board for any concerns, comments, or other non-action items they would like to present.

Alderman Buerck asks how fast bikes with motors go. Asst. Chief Jones states that can get up to speeds of 40 to 45 mph. He states that they are legal on the road under 49 ccs.

Alderman Martin extends his thanks to PW Director Layton for going out with him to review a situation.

Alderman Rice states that when he was at the soccer park two weeks ago the bathrooms were not open and no porta-potties were there. Parks & Recreation Director Cadwell tells the Board that porta-potties are on site now.

Now, at this time, upon motion by Alderman Schumer, seconded by Alderman Rice, it is ordered that the Board now convene into closed session to discuss real estate matters in accordance with Section 610.021(2) RSMo; personnel matters in accordance with Section 610.021(3) RSMo; and contractual matters in accordance with Section 610.021(9) RSMo.
